# Background, The Need, The Plan

# **Background**

Established in 1875, the Truro Curling Club, located at 56 Young St, Truro, Nova Scotia, has been a beacon of athletic achievement, community spirit, and personal wellness for 150 years. From producing athletes who have excelled on the world stage to creating a welcoming space for curlers of all ages, the club is deeply rooted in Truro's social and sporting landscape.

A history of hosting prestigious events like Provincial Championships, various Nationals, and the Grand Slam of Curling has solidified our club's reputation as a premier curling venue in Atlantic Canada. These high-profile competitions have not only brought national and international attention to our community but have also inspired a legacy of athletic excellence. Our club has proudly produced athletes who have earned medals at the provincial, national, and world championship levels—collectively totalling in the hundreds. This continued tradition of excellence showcases our commitment to growing the sport and supporting the development of top-tier talent.

The Truro Curling Club operates as a non-profit organization, with strong fiscal responsibility and a dedicated volunteer base.

Between 1941 and 1961, the Club undertook six land acquisitions, securing 4,160 square feet to support future expansion. This pivotal effort enabled the construction of a modern five-sheet curling facility in 1963, complete with a new ice plant. In 1980, the Club upgraded the building with insulation to the ceiling, upper walls, and trusses, and enhanced its exterior with brick and steel cladding. A focus on energy-efficient improvements helps reduce operational costs and minimizes our environmental footprint. Sustainable investments ensure that donor contributions and public funds are used wisely. Further improvements in 1999 included covering the ice shed's exterior with steel siding, providing both durability and a refreshed appearance.

In a testament to the strength and generosity of our curling community, past fundraising campaigns to replace aging curling rocks and install an accessibility lift was met with overwhelming success. Through the combined efforts of dedicated members, local businesses, and supportive donors, this initiative allowed us to invest in high-quality replacement rocks, ensuring consistent play for all curlers, and install a much-needed lift, making our facility inclusive and welcoming to individuals with mobility challenges. The campaign stands as a proud example of what our community can accomplish when we work together toward meaningful and lasting improvements.

#### The Need

Today, the club faces an urgent need: its aging ice-making infrastructure has suffered multiple breakdowns, causing over five weeks of missed curling during the past season. While our members have worked tirelessly to extend the life of the existing system, the current situation is no longer sustainable, significant investment is needed to ensure the future of curling in Truro.

The replacement of our ice-making plant involves more than simply upgrading equipment. Due to the configuration of our current facility, the new system will need to be installed in an entirely new location. This will require the delivery and installation of a modern, self-contained refrigeration unit, which must be housed in a new structure built onto the back end of our existing building. This addition will ensure the long-term safety, accessibility, and efficiency of the new plant, and will position the club for future upgrades including the eventual replacement of cooling lines in the floor.

Building a new facility is estimated to cost \$3 million per sheet of ice. However, thanks to previous upgrades and consistent maintenance, our current building remains in excellent condition. This allows us to concentrate our fundraising efforts on enhancing the existing location—specifically by investing in new ice-making infrastructure—resulting in a more fiscally responsible plan and a much lower cost than a rebuild.

## The Plan

The club is implementing a multi-phase facility upgrade plan to address immediate needs and plan for long-term sustainability:

#### Phase 1 - Urgent Ice Plant Replacement

- Estimated cost: \$700,000
- Funding secured to date: \$500,000 from the Province of Nova Scotia
- Remaining need: \$200,000
- Completion Timelines: Garage extension ~ late summer/early autumn 2025, Ice Plant arrival/installation ~ late November 2025

### Phase 2 - Cooling Line Replacement

- In the coming years, new cooling lines will very likely be required under the rink floor.
- This is a critical long-term investment to maintain ice quality and avoid structural failures.

We currently seek to raise the remaining \$200,000 to ensure the project can begin without delay. We also recognize that continued support will be necessary in the coming years to complete the full infrastructure renewal. Our immediate focus is on completing Phase 1 to restore consistent operations. We are fully aware that continued support will be essential in the years to come and updates will be provided as that stage unfolds.


This sponsorship level includes your company name and logo at the far end of the ice sheet seen from all spectator viewing areas. Logos and Signage lettering will be approximately 24"H.
